MARX AND ENGELS IN RUSSIA

Under the title "Die Herausgabe und Verbreitung der Werke von Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels in der UdSSR. Katalog und Auswahlbibliographie" the Karl-Marx-Haus in Trier continues its work of covering this subject in a systematic way. The first third of this little book supplies an overview of how the works of Marx and Engels were introduced into Russia. Then, there is an interesting set of 57 pictures (including the famous Vera Zasulich and Danielson, Marx' translator). The select bibliography is small but informative.

The editors promise that the same sort of reports are being prepared for France and Italy.

Such work provides a small but useful contribution to the study of the works of Marx and Engels and to understanding how their ideas were spread in various parts of the world.
