THE 6TH ALL-INDIA PEDIATRIC CONFERENCE

LUCKNOW, FEBRUARY, 1955.

Under the auspices of the Indian Pediatric Society, the 6th All-India Pediatric Conference will be held in Lucknow in February, 1955, under the presidentship of Dr. Sujata Chaudhuri, F.R.C.P.E., M.R.C.P. The deliberations of the conference will be devoted principally to the following subjects: (1) Nutritional problems of children, (2) Communicable diseases of children, (3) Normal Growth and Development, and (4) Morbidity and Mortality in children. Pediatricians, Child Health workers and medical men in general are cordially invited to present papers at the conference and participate in its deliberations. Those intending to present papers are requested to send synopses to the undersigned before the 30th November, 1954, and complete papers before the 31st December, 1954. Scientific exhibits and films of pediatric interest are also invited.
