The tubers of Seminole are round to oblong; occasionally a few are pear shaped. They have a smooth white skin, with shallow pink eyes. Its chip color, made on arrival from the field, is usually acceptable. In a number of tests it showed less reversion than Kennebec but in other tests, under certain storage conditions, reversion resulted.

Limited amounts of seed are being increased in Wisconsin.

The cooperation of the Agricultural Research Service, USDA, in making the original cross and sending to Wisconsin the progeny from which Seminole was selected is gratefully acknowledged.
