The authors and contributors offer multidisciplinary approaches including dance/movement therapy, psychology, psychoanalysis, and anthropology. As the original version of the book is now almost 20 years old, the authors wanted to include more recent studies to support the importance of embodiment, as well as provide information about how clinicians and researchers are now using the KMP in their work.
