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Correction to: A Modal View on Resource-Bounded Propositional Logics

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In the original publication of the article, the footnote 1 was incorrectly published as “Or at least as the conditional in all antecedent and consequent parts, if something like Pizzi’s weak Boethius’ Thesis, $(A \rightarrow B) \supset \sim(A \rightarrow \sim B)$, is accepted as a connexive principle”.

The correct footnote 1 is “Classical and epistemic logics suffer from logical omniscience problems as models of reasoning agents [46]. Epistemic logic [44] is thus said to model what an agent can know, or does implicitly know, by purely deductive methods”.
