



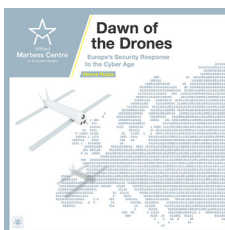
Dawn of the drones: Europe's security response to the cyber age
