This convention was not a subject of IMO's regulatory scoping exercise in substantive terms, objective of which was to evaluate whether autonomous ships (all four degrees of autonomy) would fit in the current legal framework. The objective of the exercise explains why the conclusion reached was that MASS can be incorporated by 'developing interpretations'. However, it is of little dispute that the traditional risks associated with salvage operations will transform owing to unmanned operations (Veal 2021)."
