## Chapter 33 Substitute Teacher



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## Audience: Adults (university students) Field: Education

Gabriel is a substitute professor at a State University in the countryside of São Paulo, Brazil, also working at two other institutions in order to raise money for a high-cost medical treatment for his son. When teaching a subject to the graduation class, he had two attitudes that were not very well accepted.
