## Pyogenic granuloma

- A. Rapidly growing, solitary, friable, dome-shaped red papule or nodule of granulation tissue that frequently ulcerates and bleeds
- B. A collarette of hyperplastic epithelium is usually present
- C. Most common sites are the gingiva, lip, and finger
- D. May develop after minor trauma
- E. Most common in children and young adults
- F. Often occurs on the gingiva of pregnant women
