William B. Parsons is Professor of Religious Studies at Rice University. His PhD is from the University of Chicago. He has published seven books, including *Religion and Psychology: Mapping the Terrain* and *Freud and Augustine in Dialogue: Psychoanalysis, Mysticism, and the Culture of Modern Spirituality*, as well as dozens of essays in multiple journals and anthologies. He has served as Chair of the Department of Religious Studies at Rice University, Director of the Rice University Humanities Research Center, and Editor of *Religious Studies Review*, and he has been a Fellow at the Institute for Advanced Studies at Hebrew University. June McDaniel is professor of the history of religions in the Department of Religious Studies at the College of Charleston. Her PhD is from the University of Chicago, and her MTS is from Emory University. Her most recent research has been on Hinduism in Bali, Indonesia. She has had three books and over 40 articles published. McDaniel's books include *The Madness of the Saints: Ecstatic Religion in Bengal, Offering Flowers, Feeding Skulls: Popular Goddess Worship in West Bengal, Making Virtuous Daughters and Wives: An Introduction to Women's Brata Rituals in Bengali Folk Religion, and Perceiving the Divine Through the Human Body: Mystical Sensuality* (edited with Thomas Cattoi). James W. Jones is Distinguished Professor, Emeritus, of Religion at Rutgers University and Senior Research Fellow at the Center on Terrorism at the John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York. He is also a Fellow of the American Psychological Association and a Visiting Fellow at the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom. Jones holds earned doctorates from Rutgers University (Clinical Psychology) and Brown University (Religious Studies) and an honorary doctorate from Uppsala University in Sweden. He is the author of fifteen books as well as numerous professional papers. Jones is the Editor-in-Chief of the *Archive for the Psychology of Religion*, and he maintains a private practice of clinical psychology.
