INTRODUCTION Professor W. Hagenbuch (Chairman)

Sir Alec Cairncross is one of those splendid academics who has not only thought about economics and taught economics and published a steady stream of books and articles about how the economy works and how to make it work better, but has actually practised the art of economic management.
