A1—antennule

A2—antenna

Bp—basipodite

Ep—epipodite

Enp—endopodite

Exp—exopodite

Fryer's forks—a name given by Smirnov (1992a) based on Fryer (1974) description: “modified setae (small fork consisting of a base and two branches, the smaller being a basal seta) found at the base of longer seta of the limb endites.”

IDL—inner distal lobe of the thoracic limb I

Juv—juvenile

Lb—labrum

Md—mandible

Mx—maxilla

Mxl—maxillula

Ocl—ocellus

ODL—outer distal lobe of the thoracic limb I

P1–P6—pair 1–6 of thoracic limbs

Psd—postabdomen

Psd-a—postabdomen anal margin

Psd-pre-a—postabdomen preanal margin

Psd-post-a—postabdomen postanal margin

Ro—rostrum

Seta natatoria—swimming setae

TL—total length (excluding structures such as mucros or spines of the carapace).
