News of interest to landscape ecologists

Ronald Lindmark, Director of the North Central Forest Experiment Station, US Forest Service, St. Paul, Minnesota, USA, has announced the formation of a new research project titled 'Applying the Principles of Landscape Ecology to Managing Temperate Forests'. The project will be headquartered in Rhinelander, Wisconsin and will be led by Dr. Thomas R. Crow. As far as I know, this is the first explicit use of landscape ecology by a US government agency. We understand that a second project is being organized by the US Forest Service in the Pacific Northwest.

Priscilla Golley has developed a computer list of all landscape ecologists attending meetings since the organization of the first Congress in the Netherlands.
