OBITUARY

MATVEI MARKOVICH KANTOR



Professor Matvei Markovich Kantor, metal scientist, died prematurely March 13, 1971. He was born January 8, 1906 into the family of a printer in Orsha. After completing the metallurgy course at the Moscow Mining Academy in 1930 Kantor worked at the Krasnyi Putilovets Factory and began his scientific and teaching career at the Moscow Institute of Steel and the Moscow State University.

Beginning in 1946, Kantor was the dean of the Bryansk Institute of Transportation Machine Construction. He was made head of the technology of metals and metal science department at this institute in 1959.

Kantor made a significant contribution to natural science. He published more than 65 papers and patents. He gave his knowledge and abundant talents to his students. He was intimately concerned with production and collaborated with factory personnel in solving technical problems. His thorough preparation and kind heart drew people of different ages and professions to him.

Those who knew Matvei Markovich Kantor will always retain fond memories of him.
