

OBITUARY

ABRAM EVSEEVICH KOTLYAR

After a prolonged and serious illness, death occurred on August 21, 1969 in the 72nd year of one of the oldest workers in the glass industry, Abram Evseevich Kotlyar.

Starting his working life at the Dorokhov Glass Factory, over a period of 45 years A. Kotlyar had worked continuously in the production of container glass and was one of the most famous Soviet specialists in this field.

A. E. Kotlyar took an active part in developing Soviet glass-forming bottle automatic machinery, and in setting up the mechanized production of wide-throated preserving jars. Under his direct guidance the industry put into operation such vast factories producing preserving containers as the Ordzhonikidzevskii, Khersonsk, Kamyshinsk, Leninabadsk, Tashkent, and Kutaiskii, etc. A. E. Kotlyar was the author of the book "Production of Glass Containers" and certain sections of the textbook "Technology of Glass," as well as many articles dealing with improvements in container glass production.

A specialist of high qualifications, an excellent production manager, A. E. Kotlyar made significant contributions to the development of the glass industry of our country.

A. E. Kotlyar was not only a well-known specialist in the glass industry and a leader in introducing technical ideas, but a very pleasing and responsive person, well liked by his comrades.

The memory of Abram Evseevich Kotlyar will long remain in the hearts of the workers in the glass industry.
