

OBITUARY OF DAVID EVSEEVICH MOSHINSKII

David Evseevich Moshinskii, Deputy Director of the "Order of Merit" Standards Press, Member of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union since 1947, died after a grievous illness on February 6, 1977 at the age of 65.

D. E. Moshinskii started his working activity in 1929 in the system of the State Committee of Standards attached to the USSR Council of Ministers, and worked in this system up to 1938.

He was engaged in leading administrative work for more than 30 years, as the Committee of Standards manager, deputy head of the material and technical supplies department, and deputy director of general problems in the All-Union Scientific-Research Institute of Physico-technical and Radiotechnical Measurements.

In 1967 D. E. Moshinskii started work at the Standards Press. As deputy director of the Press he paid considerable attention to problems of material and technical provisions, and the development of the Standard Press shops' network.

For his active and fruitful work D. E. Moshinskii was awarded the Medal "For valorous work in the period of the Great Patriotic War" and "For valorous work in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of V. I. Lenin's birthday."

David Evseevich Moshinskii was a sensitive and responsive man. His radiant image will remain in the hearts of all those who collaborated with him in his working and social activities.
