

## CHRONOLOGY

1967:

Dec. 6–9 Second Symposium on 'The Analysis of Tendencies and the Prognosis of Scientific-Technical Progress', in Kiev. Participating were 250 philosophers, logicians and scientists from the USSR, Poland, Czechoslovakia and East Germany (*FN* 1969,2, 182–186).

1968:

Apr. 16–19 MGU conference commemorating the 150th anniversary of Marx's birth, on the theme 'Karl Marx and the Problems of Contemporary World Social Development' (*V MGU* 1969,1, 81–84).

May 27–28 Conference in Tomsk on system-structural analysis in the social sciences (*FN* 1969,1, 171–173).

July All-Union conference devoted to the theme 'The Mathematization of Knowledge'. Meeting in Novosibirsk were 200 philosophers and mathematicians (*VP* 1969,2, 147–150).

Sept. 21 – Visit to England by Soviet philosophers A. F. Šiškin, Ju. K.

Oct. 4 Mel'vil', L. N. Mitrošin and O. G. Drobnickij, to discuss problems of ethics with British ethicists (*VP* 1969,2, 143–147)

Sept. 27–30 All-Union symposium in Alma-Ata on dialectical logic. Goal of the meeting was to present the results of recent work and to determine the tasks and problems for the future development of dialectics (*FN* 1969,2, 187–191).

October Third symposium on the epistemological problems of measurement, in Užgorod. The two main topics were: The Correlation Between Theory and Experiment, and The Logico-Epistemological Analysis of Measurement (*VP* 1969,3, 149–153).

October Novosibirsk symposium on 'The Construction of Models (*modelirovanie*) of Psychic Activity' (*VP* 1969,4, 154–157).
