## IN MEMORIAM LEV IVANOVICH GOLUBEV



Lev Ivanovich Golubev, an eminent specialist in the domain of nuclear power, Candidate of Technical Sciences, Lenin prize laureate, deputy chief engineer of the Novovoronezhskaya Atomic Power Plant, and member of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, died May 4, 1978, at the age of 55.

His creative and scientific career began in 1950 when he graduated from Moscow State University and was linked with the establishment and development of atomic science and engineering. From 1965 to the end of his day L. I. Golubev worked in the Novovoronezhskaya Atomic Power Plant, where more than 50 research projects were carried out under his leadership and the results published.

The Soviet government expressed high regard for the services of L. I. Golubev, awarding him the Orders of Lenin and the Red Banner of Labor as well as many medals.

The bright memory of Lev Ivanovich Golubev will always remain in the hearts of all who knew and worked with him.
