## Erratum

In Social Class and Infantile Autism, by Christopher Gillberg and Helen Schaumann (1982, Volume 12, Number 3), on page 227, the second paragraph of the Discussion should read as follows:

The choice of comparison group presents a slight problem. Social conditions usually improve somewhat with increasing "age" of a family (e.g., Klackenberg et al., 1968). Thus, the random sample is not quite representative for comparison, since all children in this group were 7 years old and the mean age in the autistic sample was 10.6 years (range $4-16$ years). However, this would then have no bearing on the main conclusion of the present study (that autistic children do not tend to come from socially privileged families), since increasing age would lead to better social conditions in the comparison group and hence relatively lower social class in the autistic sample.
