counterproductive and lead to catastrophic results, as did the spurious oil shortage in the seventies, which rocked the world economy and helped to produce the debt crisis. It is therefore of crucial importance that such interdisciplinary discussion among scientists is continued to serve as a contrawheight to popular exaggerations. In many cases, several authors have dealt with the same problem and the reader can compare their factual information and different, sometimes contradictory, arguments. But this is made very difficult by the lack of a good, comprehensive subject index, a serious omission in a book of this type.
