Tenth World's Poultry Congress, 1954

The Tenth World's Poultry Congress will be held in Edinburgh, Scotland, from 13th to 21st August, 1954 under the auspices of the World's Poultry Science Association. The Congress is being organised by the Department of Agriculture for Scotland. Full details about the Congress, including membership fees, will be available shortly and will be mailed direct, on request to the Congress Secretariat.

The activities of the Congress will include a program of papers and discussions on every phase of the poultry industry and the National Committees of the World's Poultry Science Association will receive papers from authors.

The headings of the sections at the paper reading sessions will be those laid down by the World's Poultry Science Association as follows:—

(a) Genetics and Breeding; (b) Physiology and Nutrition; (c) Diseases and their Control; (d) Economics and Marketing; (e) Husbandry and Miscellaneous.

A paper should not exceed 3,000 words or be less than 1.500 words. It should be typewritten in duplicate in either of the official languages which are *English and French* and be accompanied by a résumé not exceeding 300 words in the same language as that of the original paper.

Titles of papers proposed to be submitted should be sent to the Congress Secretariat. All papers must, without fail, be in the hands of the Congress Secretariat by 1st January, 1954. The address is: St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh, 1.

A Symposium on the Origins of Resistance to Drugs, etc. is being organized by the Office of Naval Research and the University of Pennsylvania. The symposium will consist of five successive sessions each devoted to one of the following group of topics: (1) The Origins of Microbial Drug Resistance; (2) Tolerance and Addiction to Drugs, and Alcoholism; (3) Resistance to Insecticides, Herbicides, (4) Factors in Resistance to Infectious Agents; Biochemical Mechanism of Carcinogenesis and the Nature of Tumor Immunity, and (5) Concluding Session, devoted to the integration of the questions of Resistance from the Genetic, Physiological and Chemical Points of View. The papers by the invited speakers will be followed by open discussion from the audience. The symposium will take place during March the 25th, 26th, and 27th, 1954, in Washington, D.C.
