

Bertrand Russell Memorial Logic Conference, Essay Prize:

A prize of £200 is offered for an essay which examines in detail some aspect of the relationship between mathematics and the development of social or economic conditions. The essay should be of general interest to mathematicians, and preferably to a wider readership. It should include a consideration of current mathematical practice. Essays should be at most 20,000 words long and should be typewritten. They may be written in English, Spanish, French, Japanese, Polish or Russian. Essays should be sent so as to arrive by February 1st 1976. All essays and enquiries about the prize should be addressed to: Bertrand Russell Memorial Essay Prize, c/o Dr. A. Slomson, School of Mathematics, The University, Leeds LS2 9JT, England.
