Memoir

WALSH, JOSEPH ANTHONY, Blakely-Olyphant, Pennsylvania; born September 17, 1913, Olyphant, Pennsylvania; Hahnemann Medical College 1939; internship Scranton State Hospital; served with U. S. Armed Forces during World War II.

Dr. Walsh was elected to membership in the American Proctologic Society in 1955 and became an Associate Fellow in 1964. He was a member of the American Medical Association, Pennsylvania Medical Society, Lackawanna County Medical Society, Pennsylvania Society of Colon and Rectal Surgery, New York Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons, American Geriatrics Society, and past president, Lehigh Valley Medical Society; on the staff at Community Medical Center, East and West, Scranton State General, Mercy and Moses Taylor Hospitals, Scranton; Carbondale General and St. Joseph's Hospitals, Carbondale. He died September 24, 1968.
