## **OBITUARY**

## **GENNADII FEDOROVICH MASLOVSKII**

Gennadii Fedorovich Maslovskii, 74, one of the oldest builders in the power industry, former chief of the Main Administration for Operating Eastern Power Systems (Glavvostrokénergo) of the USSR Ministry of Power and Electrification and veteran of World War II, died on December 5, 1996.

The entire life of Gennadii Fedorovich after the war was associated with the hydropower industry. He participated in and supervised the construction of the largest facilities on the Volga and in the Far East, in Siberia and Central Asia. His contribution to the construction of the Aswan High Dam as considerable.

The motherland highly evaluated the services of Gennadii Fedorovich, having awarded him the Order of Lenin, four Orders of the Red Banner of Labor, and the Order of Glory of the III class. He was conferred the title "Honored Builder of the USSR."

His work is immortalized in concrete and stone of the Bratsk, Krasnoyarsk, Kolyma, Nurek, and many other hydrostations.

Everyone who worked with Gennadii Fedorovich will remember him not only as a leader but also as a sympathetic and sincere person. The memory of Gennadii Fedorovich Maslovskii will remain forever in the hearts of builders in the power industry.
