“Student Response in Programmed Instruction”

Many individuals have tried unsuccessfully to obtain copies of the book *Student Response in Programmed Instruction*, edited by A. A. Lumsdaine for the National Academy of Sciences—National Research Council. Inquiries about how to obtain this book (S.R.P.I.) have increased in frequency since its citation by Wilbur Schramm in his recent publication, *Programmed Instruction*, issued by the Ford Foundation. A number of persons have understandably addressed inquiries directly to the National Academy of Sciences, only to be told that the book is out of print. As of this writing, this statement is untrue (although it is true that the supply of copies at the National Academy has been exhausted). S.R.P.I. can in fact be obtained by requesting it (price, \$5) from the Office of Technical Services, U.S. Department of Commerce, specifying it either by its title and editorship or by its O.T.S. publication number—AD 281936.
