
outlet presented, as before. Fig. 5 shows the practical advantage which this plan possesses. There is nothing to interfere with the view of a large class; the position of the head in its different stages can be easily seen, and, by simply rotating the pelvis, the base of the cranium or vertex can be equally well shown. The coccyx should be so articulated as to be movable, and a pelvis with an artificial perinæum would add to the value, if any there is in my plan.



Messrs. Mayer and Weltiger are at present making for me an improved stand, and adding an artificial perinæum to this pelvis, with movable coccyx.
