Splenic Histiocytes.

Dr. T. J. MACDOUGALD read a communication on "A study of the postmortem changes in the Spleen, with special reference to the Histiocytes."

The application of a very rapid fixation method by plunging live rats into liquid air, breaking them in pieces and placing the spleens in absolute alcohol at -50° C. was described, and the results compared with spleen fixed in Susa within 1 minute of death, with pieces kept in isotonic saline at 37° C. for 1 hour before fixation, and with spleen fixed after perfusion with Ringer for 20 minutes.

Very little definite evidence concerning the question of "open" versus "closed" circulation can be offered, but what little there is is in favour of Knisely's description of a "closed" circulation.

With regard to the appearance of histiocytes, no histiocytes were found in either spleens fixed in liquid air-alcohol, or in Susa within one minute of death, but, on the other hand, many of these cells, some containing ingested erythrocytes, were present in spleens allowed to remain for 1 hour at 37° C. in isotonic saline before fixation, and also in spleens fixed after perfusion with Ringer.

It was suggested that the appearance of typical histiocytes in such spleens is a post-mortem change.
