WORLD FEDERATION OF SOCIETIES OF ANAESTHESIOLOGISTS

THE THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the World Federation of Societies of Anaesthesiologists was held in São Paulo, Brazil, on the occasion of the III^d World Congress of Anaesthesiologists in September 1964. Delegates of the Canadian Anaesthetists' Society to the General Assembly were Dr. S. M. Campbell, Dr. R. A. Gordon, Dr. Léon Longtin, and Dr. John Poole. The Assembly adopted a revision of the Constitution of 1955 and considered and approved the reports of the Executive Committee and the standing committees on Finance and Membership. Dr. Geoffrey Organe of Great Britain was elected President of the Federation, succeeding Professor C. R. Ritsema Van Eck of The Netherlands; Professor Otto Mayrhoffer of Austria was elected Secretary and Professor Henning Poulsen of Denmark became Treasurer, succeeding Dr. Organe, who has filled the combined office of Secretary-Treasurer since the founding of the Federation.

Dr. R. A. Gordon retired from the Executive Committee of the Federation on completion of a term of nine years. Dr. Léon Longtin of Canada was elected to the Executive Committee. Dr. Gordon continues as Chairman of the Membership Committee.

London, England, was selected as the site of the Fourth World Congress of Anaesthesiologists to be held in 1968.

The General Assembly authorized the creation of a Foundation under the World Federation to assist in the organization and financing of Anaesthesia Training Centres in those parts of the world where Anaesthetic services are underdeveloped. This Foundation is to be administered by a Committee responsible to the Executive Committee of the World Federation. The Chairman of the Committee is Professor Robert Hingson, U.S.A. Members of the Committee are: Professor John Bonica, U.S.A.; Professor R. A. Gordon, Canada; Professor Zairo Vieira, Brazil; Professor Luiz Cabrera-Guarderas, Chile; Professor Sir Robert Macintosh, Great Britain; Professor T. Cecil Gray, Great Britain; Professor Harry Grant-Whyte, South Africa; Dr. K. Odura, Ghana; Dr. R. Ghose, Ethiopia; Professor Quintin Gomez, Philippines; Professor Hideo Yamamura, Japan; Dr. Victor Hercus, Australia; Dr. J. R. Ritchie, New Zealand.

BRITISH COLUMBIA DIVISION

An additional meeting of the British Columbia Division, C.A.S., was held on June 26, 1964, in honour of Dr. H. C. Churchill-Davidson, who lectured on the use of curare in clinical anaesthesia. Special emphasis was given the use of electrical stimulation of a peripheral nerve to detect the presence and degree of neuromuscular blockade at the termination of surgery.

Harold Rice, Ph.D., M.D., Director of Research, St. Paul's Hospital Clinical Investigation Unit, Vancouver, B.C., spoke to the British Columbia Division, C.A.S., at their regular monthly meeting, held September 25. Dr. Rice criticized

the manufacturers of medical equipment for producing operating room monitoring devices that were unnecessarily bulky and complicated. He emphasized that most doctors have little if any engineering knowledge and consequently were unable to operate and maintain this equipment. Dr. Rice demonstrated equipment made at St. Paul's Hospital to monitor arterial blood pressure end tidal carbon dioxide, blood pCO_2 , and pH. All this equipment was portable, technically simple to operate, and relatively inexpensive.

ALBERTA DIVISION

Dr. Harry Churchill-Davidson of St. Thomas' Hospital, London, was a visitor to the University Hospital, Edmonton, following which he travelled to Calgary, to attend the Calgary Stampede.

Dr. Helen E. Gordon has returned to Canada from England and has established

a practice in Anaesthesia in Calgary.
