DR. VIOLET A. I. LARSEN

THE DEATH of Dr. Violet A. I. Larsen occurred in the Innisfail Hospital, Innisfail, Alberta, on November 24, 1969, after a prolonged illness. Dr. Larsen was born in Alberta, and her preliminary education was in Alberta rural schools and at the Dickson High School in Alberta. She graduated from the University of Alberta Medical School in 1940.

Following internship in Edmonton, Alberta, and Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Dr. Larsen conducted a general practice in Saskatchewan and British Columbia for many years. She enrolled on the postgraduate course in anaesthesia at the University of British Columbia in 1954, and completed her training in Regina, Saskatchewan. On receipt of her certification, she practiced for many years with Associated Anaesthetists of Regina, retiring a few years ago due to ill-health. She was a member of the Canadian Medical Association and the Canadian Anaesthetists' Society before her retirement.

Dr. Larsen had gained a fine reputation as a general practitioner and as a specialist in anaesthesia. She was respected and well-liked by her associates. She is survived by her husband, Mr. Lorenz Lung, of Dickson, Alberta. She was fifty-four years of age at the time of her death.
