OBITUARY

DR. HARRY A. L. MURPHY

DR. HARRY A. L. MURPHY died October 14, 1962, at \$t. Joseph's Hospital, Toronto, where he had been an anaesthetist since 1946. He had been ill since October 3, when he suffered a cerebral haemorrhage.

Dr. Murphy was born in Phelpston, Ontario, received his early education at Stayner, and graduated in Pharmacy at the University of Toronto. He later graduated in Medicine from Queen's University in 1938, and practised with his father, the late Dr. A. E. Murphy, in Stayner until 1941.

In 1941 he joined the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps and then took a post-graduate course in Anaesthesia at McGill University. During the remaining three years of World War II he was on the staff at the Halifax Military Hospital.

In 1945 Dr. Murphy joined the Anaesthetic Staff of St. Joseph's Hospital, Toronto, where he had interned. He served on the Pharmacy Committee for many years, and will be greatly missed by his own staff as well as the entire hospital management.

He was an active member of All Saint's Anglican Church, from which church he was buried.

Dr. Murphy is survived by his wife and four children, his mother, Mrs. Lena Murphy of Stayner, and a brother, Arthur B. Murphy of Toronto.

DOCTOR JAMES ERNEST CARMICHAEL

DOCTOR JAMES ERNEST CARMICHAEL, 72, died in Edmonton, Alberta, July, 1962. Born in Ontario, Dr. Carmichael received his B.SC. and M.D. degrees at Queen's University. He came to Edmonton in 1914 and, except for a period of postgraduate work in New York, spent his entire years of medical practice in the city of Edmonton. For many years he combined general practice and anaesthesia, as was the custom of his time, and he was one of the area's leading practitioners of anaesthesia. During the Second World War he carried an exceptionally heavy load of anaesthesia in the city of Edmonton and also carried the teaching load at the University of Alberta. Because of failing health he retired from active practice in 1955 and lived in retirement until his death. He is survived by his widow, and two sons and a daughter.
