

and the size of the operation are very different. Nevertheless, as far as hospitals are concerned, we believe that with their broad scientific training, specific skills in statistical analysis, pharmacology and negotiation, pharmacists are well placed to act in this link position. Whatever the structure of the communication channel, we propose that it should exist and be recognised if we are to enhance the efficiency with which NHS resources are utilised.
