


IN MEMORIAM

A tribute to the memory of Ed Rall and Jack Robbins



Prof. Jack Robbins

As one of the first Italian visiting scientists who had the privilege, in the early '60s, of working in the National Institute of Health (NIH), in Bethesda, MD, USA, under the guidance of Ed Rall and Jack Robbins, I had the honor of being invited to the meeting held on February 13th, 2009, celebrating the Life and Science of these two great scientists, as recalled by Philip Gorden and Ira Pastan. The meeting was very touching and scientifically outstanding as can be evinced from the Agenda. Also attending, from Italy, were Roberto di Lauro, Aldo Pinchera, Fabrizio Monaco, Salvatore Aloj, Saverio Ambesi, Salvatore Benvenga, and Giancarlo Vecchio, who, like many other Italians (see the Table for official list) had also enjoyed the privilege of attending the NIH and the unique opportunity to work and learn along-

side Ed and Jack. From the very large number of colleagues, from all over the world, present on that occasion, Ed and Jack clearly contributed not only a great deal to furthering a better understanding in this scientific field, but also to establishing collaboration between the various groups worldwide.

Both had often been to Italy to Congresses and Meetings focusing on the Thyroid. One very special occasion was the Fifth International Thyroid Conference, held in Rome, in May 1965, as recalled by Luigi Frati, current Dean and Rector at the University "Sapienza" of Rome, and by our friend Marian Shields who actively collaborated in the organization, but also the editing of the Proceedings (over 1200 pages) "Current Topics

in *Thyroid Research*", published in December 1965 by Academic Press (New York and London). On that occasion we had a special audience received by the President of the Republic in the Quirinale and The Pope Paolo VI in Vatican City.

As already mentioned, many Italian colleagues from various parts of Italy, had the privilege of spending some time at the NIH studying and collaborating under the guidance of Ed and Jack. Besides myself (the first Italian), to recall just a few:

Professor Luigi Frati, Rector of the "Sapienza" University of Rome and Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, was unable to be present at the recent meeting held in Bethesda, but had been actively involved in meetings with Ed and Jack on several occasions and for the memorable International Scientific Meetings, held at the Accademia dei Lincei in Rome in 1972, focused on "*Molecular Mechanisms and regulation of Thyroid Hormones Biosynthesis - an example of International collaboration*".

I should like to remember that both Ed and Jack have been granted the honorary degree (*laurea honoris causa*) by the Italian Faculties of Medicine: Federico II University, in Naples (Ed Rall), and the University of Messina (Jack Robbins); in both occasions I have had the gratifying privilege to act as co-chairman of these Faculties.
