His clinical interests focus on surgery of the pancreas and biliary tree. His research interests include surgical nutrition and metabolism, fluid and electrolyte balance, perioperative care and pancreatic cancer. He has published over 320 peer-reviewed articles and currently has an ISI H-index of 66 (80 on Google Scholar) and an I10 of 192. He is Associate Editor of Clinical Nutrition. He was awarded the Fellowship of the American College of Surgeons and was elected to the Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh. He is Chair of the Scientific Committee of the ERAS Society and has been Chair of the Scientific Committee the European Society for Clinical Nutrition and Metabolism (ESPEN). He has been Honorary Secretary of the Society of Academic and Research Surgery and President of the International Association for Surgical Metabolism and Nutrition. He is the current President of the Surgical Research Society.
