It is about a book centered on the microsurgery describing of many varied techniques covering all the pallet of the indications of rebuilding of the upper limb.

The first part relates to the restoration of the sensitivity with scraps, joinings and nervous grafts, followed by chapters of repair and rebuilding of the nerves, then brachial plexus and finally of the motor nerves.

Then the following chapters treat rebuilding of the bones and articulations by vascularized scraps, then of the cutaneous cover before finishing by the rescue operations.

Each chapter describes not only the indications and counter indications but also the pitfalls.

The carefully described procedure is based starting from knowledge anatomical and accompanied by many illustrations and drawings facilitating comprehension. In addition this book is very practical with many drawings and photographs, as well as councils of use to facilitate the training of the techniques.

In addition an access online is provided to have access to complementary videos still reinforcing the comprehension of the techniques.

It is thus about a very interesting book has the time for a surgeon beginning as well as experienced.
