Ulrich Pfeffer

Ulrich Pfeffer studied Biology at the Free University of Berlin and worked in Prof. Randolph Lochmann's lab for his master and PhD. He received his PhD in 1987 presenting a thesis on histone acetylation. He moved then to the National Cancer Research Institute in Genoa where he worked with Giorgio Vidali and later with Adriana Albini. In 1993, he started working with the Functional Genomics Section of the National Cancer Research Institute that has been integrated with the Academic Hospital San Martino of Genoa, and became its director since 2004. His research interest is cancer genomics, mainly transcriptomics, with special regard to uveal melanoma and more recently cutaneous melanoma. He is General Secretary of the European Society for Translational Medicine.

Paola Queirolo is a Consultant of the Medical Oncology Unit at the IRCCS Azienda Ospedaliera Universitaria San Martino IST - Istituto Nazionale Per La Ricerca Sul Cancro (National Institute for Cancer Research) in Genoa, Italy. She obtained her MD at Genoa University School of Medicine (Italy) in 1987 followed by residency at the National Institute for Cancer Research until 1990. For nearly 20 years, she has conducted basic and translational research in melanoma therapies, including immunotherapy and targeted therapies. She is currently Leader and Co-Principal Investigator of several national and international programs on melanoma research. She is the Past President of the Italian Melanoma Intergroup. She is author of more than 140 publications on international peer-reviewed journals with an impact factor.
