

## **Obituary**

### **Louis Pojman (1935–2005)**

It is with deep regret that I report the death of Louis Pojman, one of our Associate Editors. He died peacefully at his home, October 15, 2005. Born in Chicago, Illinois, Lou studied at Nyack College (BS), Union Theological Seminary (PhD) and Oxford University (DPhil). He taught at University of Notre Dame, the University of Texas at Dallas and the University of Mississippi, where he was Chair of the Department of Philosophy and Religion. In 1995 he was appointed Professor of Philosophy at the United States Military Academy at West Point. He retired from West Point in 2004 in order to be Visiting Fellow of Clare Hall, Cambridge. Lou was particularly well known for his work on Kierkegaard and for his widely used texts and anthologies covering topics from the history of philosophy to epistemology, ethics and the philosophy of religion. Lou was a person of strong convictions, but I could always count on him to provide careful and fair reviews of articles even in cases where the author's views conflicted with his own.
