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The original version of this article unfortunately contained two mistakes.

In the second paragraph and last sentence under “**Assessment**” section, the following is the corrected sentence.

Assessment and treatment of factors such as anxiety sensitivity and hyperarousal covered in a previous section may reduce morbidity.

In the third paragraph and sixth sentence under “**Treatment**” section, the following is the corrected sentence.

Recommended therapeutic interventions for trauma often take a cognitive-behavioral framework [91, 92]. TF-CBT [93], play therapy [94], eye movement desensitization and reprocessing [95], and prolonged exposure [72] are treatments with research support in disaster affected populations and thus may be beneficial for survivors of mass shootings.
