Persuaded by his advisor at Sam Houston State University to consider social work, he received a MSW from the University of Houston and later a Ph.D. in social work from the University of Minnesota. In 1989, he was hired as an assistant professor of social work in the College of Social Work at Ohio State University. He was tenured and promoted to associate professor in 1995 and full professor in 2000.
