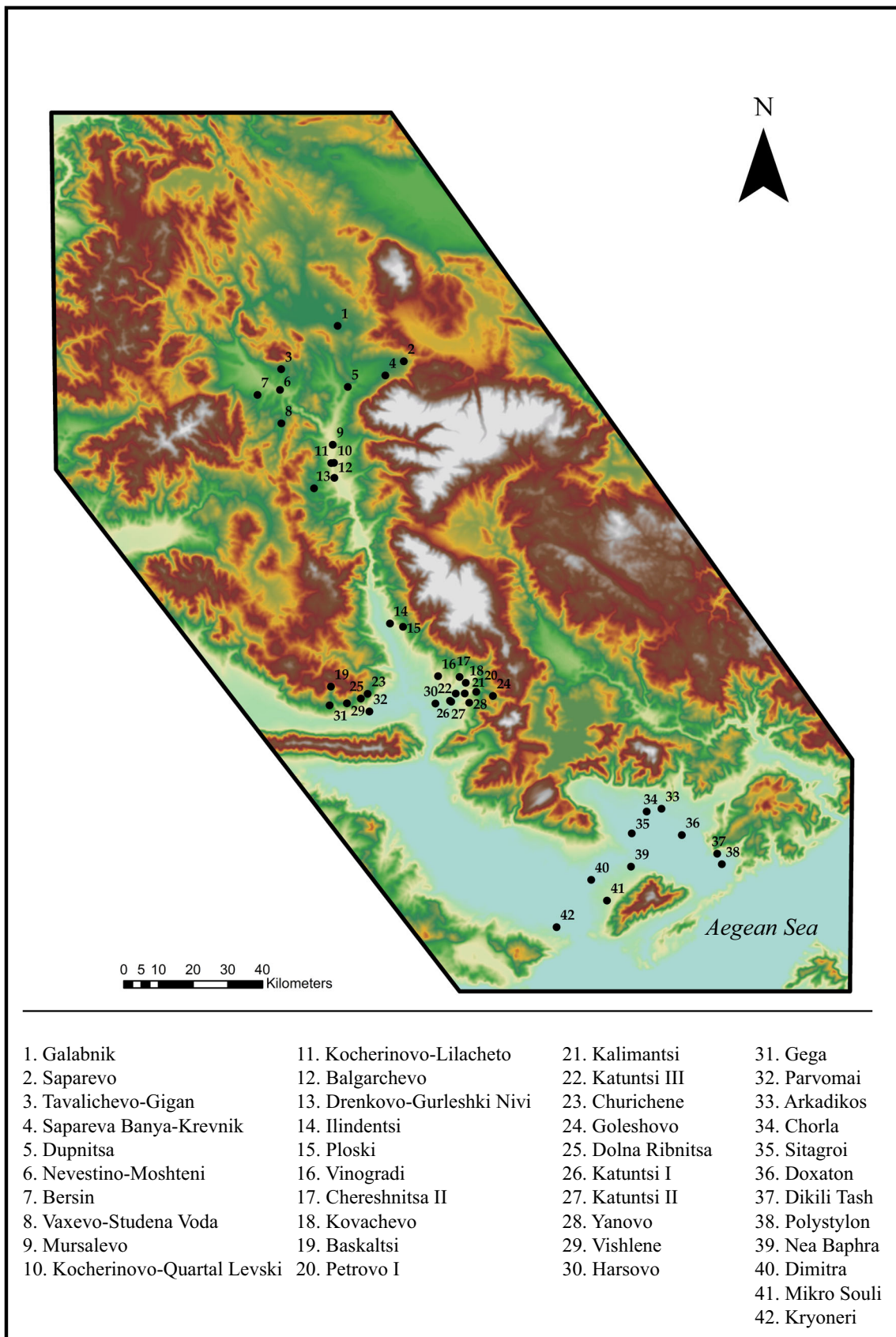

**Fig. 3** Middle Neolithic settlements

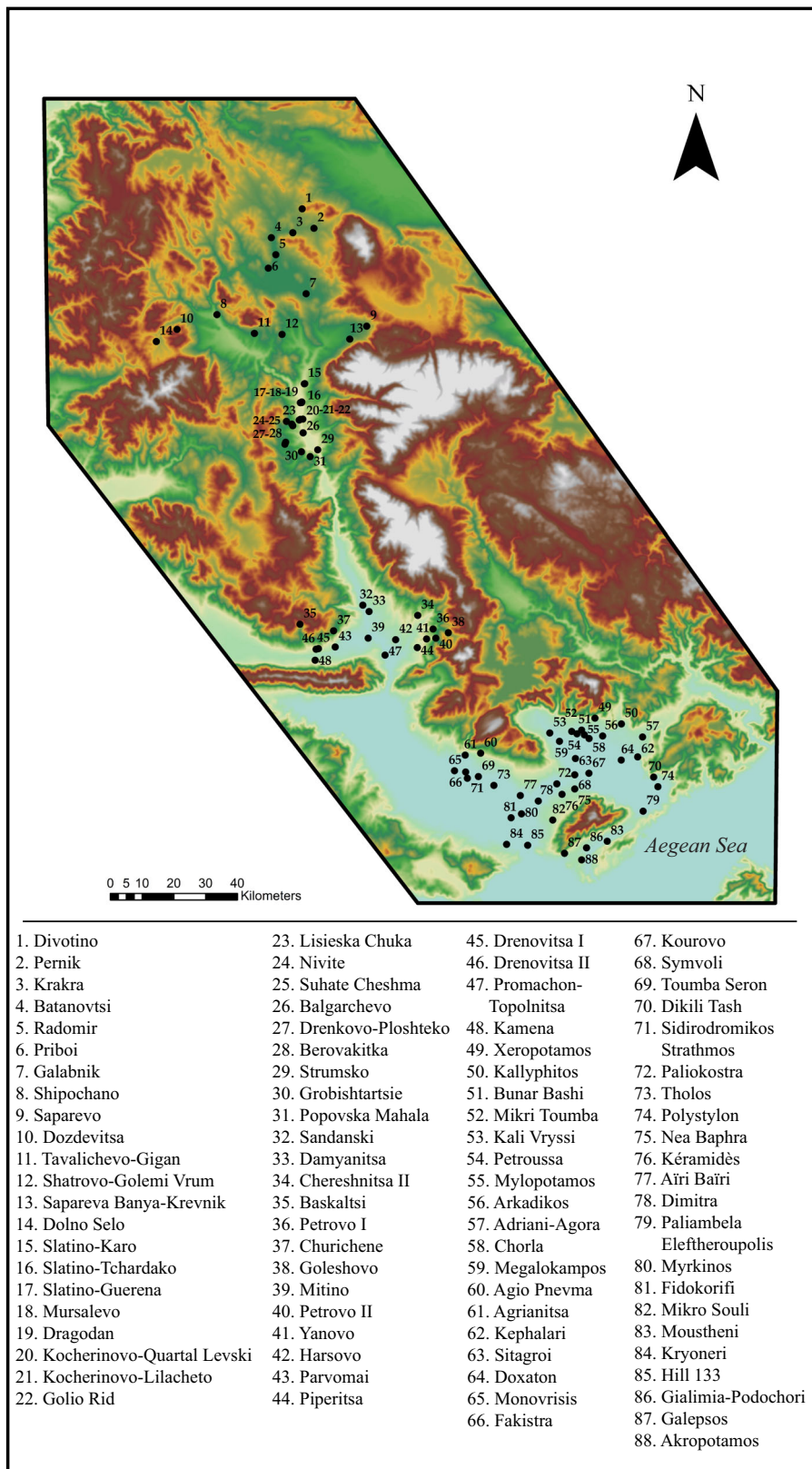


Fig. 4 Late Neolithic settlements
