The subject chosen was “Dams and Environment: Pros and Cons”. Dr. Kalpana Deka Kalita, organizing secretary welcomed the participants, students, Teacher in charge from various schools of Dibrugarh district, parents, faculties from different departments and centers of Dibrugarh University and guests. In her speech she said the United Nations General Assembly designated June 5 as Environment Day to create public awareness to preserve environment. The date 5th June was chosen because it was the opening day of the United Nations Stockholm Conference on human environment from 5-16 June 1972. The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) was also established. It is headquartered in Nairobi, Kenya. World Environment Day is hosted every year by a different city with a different theme. Since 1987 a host city marks the start of the day. The theme of this year's World Environment Day is "Green Economy: Does it include you?" It invites everyone to both assess where the Green Economy fits in their daily lives and evaluate whether development through these pathways towards a Green Economy can deliver the kind of social, economic and environmental outcomes needed in a world of seven billion people. The UNEP has defined the Green Economy as one that results in improved human well-being and social equity, while significantly reducing environmental risks and ecological scarcities. She also informed the participants that United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) had announced Brazil as global host of World Environment Day 2012. Lastly she appealed the student community to work towards conservation of our mother earth for future generation and to make everyday a World Environment Day.
