The original version of this article contained errors in the following sentences.

On page 120, there is an error in the sentence “Furthermore, 0.55% per mSv excess is a mean among all age strata (life-long) and among all cancers from low to high-sensitive cancers to radiation.” It should be “Furthermore, 0.55% per 100 mSv.”

On page 125, there is an error in the sentence “Later, in a speech by Professor Nagataki in the Cabinet Office, Government of Japan, on June 30, 2015, a slide was used illustrating that “there are no health effects under 100 mSv/hour” [71].” It should be “under 100 mSv/year.”
