


Fig. 1 Afrocentric socialization path model for the study of Black youth positive development

Proposed Pathways of Afrocentric Socialization on PYD among Black Youth




Fig. 1 Proposed pathways of Afrocentric socialization on PYD among Black youth. The model aligns with Murry et al.'s (2018) Black family stress model and Learner's (2009) Five Cs of positive youth development, incorporating previously published Afrocentric interventions.
