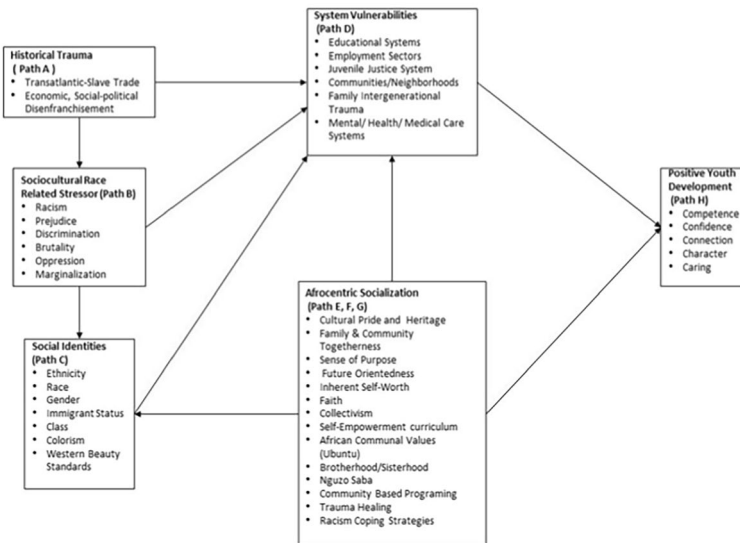


Fig. 1 Afrocentric socialization path model for the study of Black youth positive development

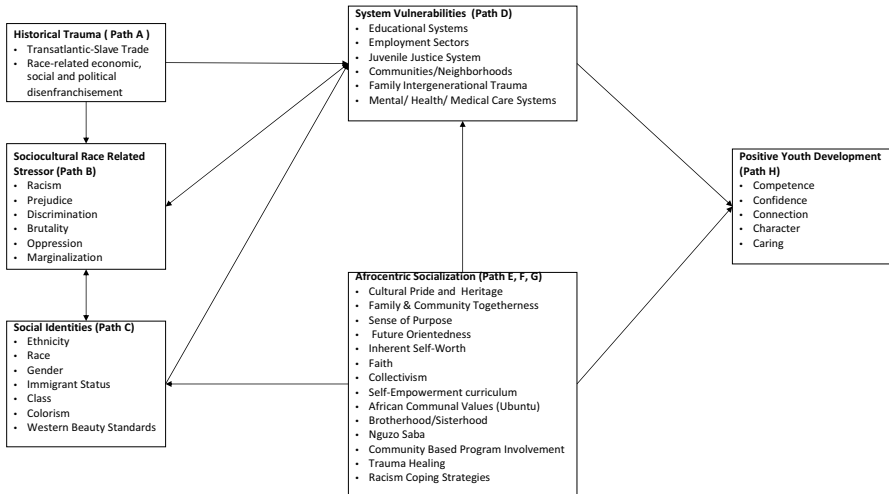
