Update on NLM/PubMed Status

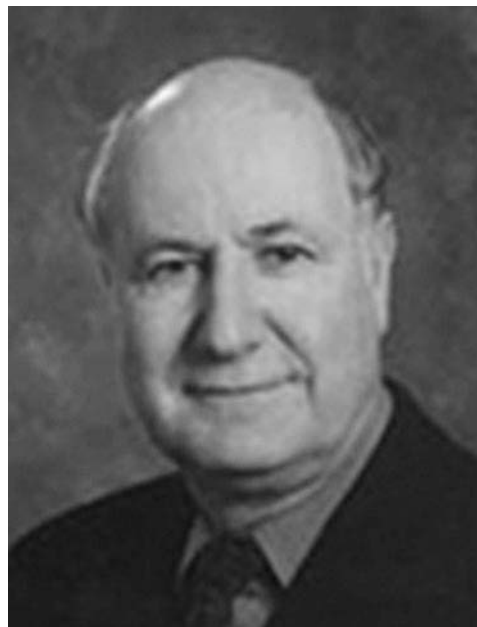
There is important news regarding Spine Deformity citation in PubMed.

The NLM guidelines for citation in PubMed has changed, with positive implications for Spine Deformity. When we receive approval from NLM, Elsevier would send data on ALL previously published articles (Title, authors, key words) to PubMed who would enter the data and the manuscripts would then be citable and searchable through PubMed. After the approval date PubMed would begin entering the Spine Deformity content with full MESH data for new articles.

This is a significant change as once we receive approval from PubMed, all Spine Deformity content will be in PubMed with significant implications for all the authors, and status with their academic institutions.

The plan is for an application in July 2016, with review in October 2016 with a decision the following month.

Base on this change I would encourage article submissions as the PubMed status will change for these once published.
