THE ODED LEVIN PRIZE

THE OBJECT of the prize is to perpetuate the memory of Dr. Oded Levin (1934–1969). Dr. Levin was a member of ORSIS and ORSA and was one of the leading Israeli scientists in the field of Operational Research.

Scientific works in the field of Operational Research, including completed theses for academic degrees and works published within three years prior to the date of submission, will be considered for the prize. The award will be given for work representing original research of theoretical and/or practical significance, provided such work has not previously won a prize.

Works submitted will be considered by a Panel of Judges, appointed by the Trustees of the Oded Levin Prize Fund. Prize winners will be issued with a certificate in addition to a monetary award of approximately Il. 2500.

Manuscripts or other material should be submitted in duplicate, in English or Hebrew, printed or typewritten, not later than 1 November 1971, to:
