

### **MEETING ABSTRACT**

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# Protective effect of uric acid against 6-OHDA-induced injury in SH-SY5Y cells

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#### **Objective**

To investigate the effect of uric acid (UA) on 6-hydroxy-dopamine (6-OHDA) -induced injury in SH-SY5Y cells.

#### **Methods**

The cell viability was measured by the MTT reduction assay. The cell apoptosis was assessed by Hoechst 33342 staining with fluorescence microscopy. The phophorylation of Akt and GSK-3 $\beta$ (ser9) was determined by Western blot analysis.

#### **Results**

Treatment with 6-OHDA at  $50\mu M$  for 12 h significantly decreased the viability of SH-SY5Y cells. Pretreatment with UA (200-400 $\mu M$ , 0.5h) prior to 6-OHDA treatment markedly increased the cell viability of SH-SY5Y cells, as compared to that of 6-OHDA-treated group. The beneficial effects of UA against 6-OHDA-induced apoptosis were also confirmed by Hoechst 33342 staining assay. Moreover, 6-OHDA decreased the Akt activity and increased the GSK-3 $\beta$  activity, which could be blocked by UA (200-400 $\mu M$ ) pretreatment.

#### **Conclusions**

These data suggest that 6-OHDA-induced cell injury was attenuated by UA. The underlying mechanisms may involve the up-regulation of Akt and the reduction of GSK-3 $\beta$  activity.

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
