

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For patients with atypical high-risk breast lesions, select factors are associated with the risk of upstage to breast cancer, subsequent development of breast cancer, or both. In this large cohort of women with a diagnosis of high-risk breast histology (https://doi.org/10.1245/s10434-022-1231 3-6), there was no association with body mass index (BMI).



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
