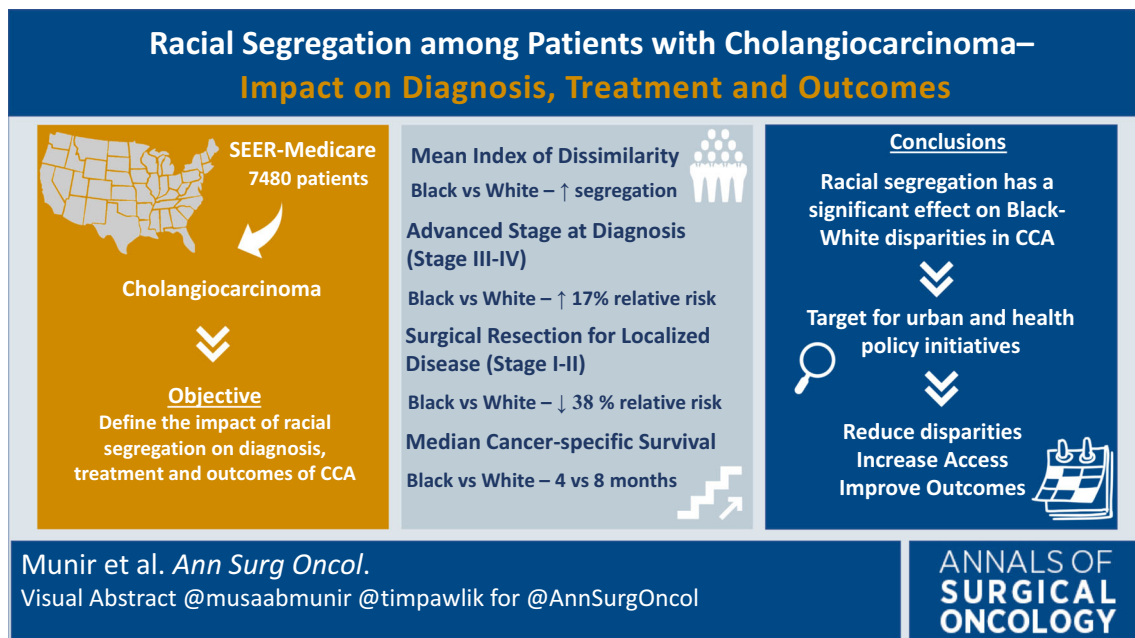
ASO Visual Abstract: Racial Segregation Among Patients with Cholangiocarcinoma: Impact on Diagnosis, Treatment, and Outcomes

The role of racial segregation relative to cholangiocarcinoma diagnosis, treatment and outcomes is not known. Racial segregation, as a proxy for structural racism, had a marked effect on Black–white disparities among patients

with cholangiocarcinoma. Continued efforts are needed to address historical structural inequities to improve downstream health outcomes of patients with cancer (<https://doi.org/10.1245/s10434-023-13122-1>).
