

The Society of Surgical Oncology (SSO)'s "Choosing Wisely" recommendations caution against routine use of sentinel node biopsy (SLNBx) for women over 70 years with T1 breast cancer. This study (https://doi.org/10.1245/

s10434-023-13886-6) examines oncologic safety of avoiding SLNBx in patients with invasive lobular carcinoma (ILC). Results suggest these criteria are appropriate for this population.
