ASO Visual Abstract: Is Choosing Wisely Wise for Lobular Carcinoma in Patients Over 70? A National Cancer Database (NCDB) Analysis of Sentinel Node Practice Patterns

The Society of Surgical Oncology (SSO)’s “Choosing Wisely” recommendations caution against routine use of sentinel node biopsy (SLNBx) for women over 70 years with T1 breast cancer. This study ([https://doi.org/10.1245/](https://doi.org/10.1245/s10434-023-13886-6)

[s10434-023-13886-6](https://doi.org/10.1245/s10434-023-13886-6)) examines oncologic safety of avoiding SLNBx in patients with invasive lobular carcinoma (ILC). Results suggest these criteria are appropriate for this population.
